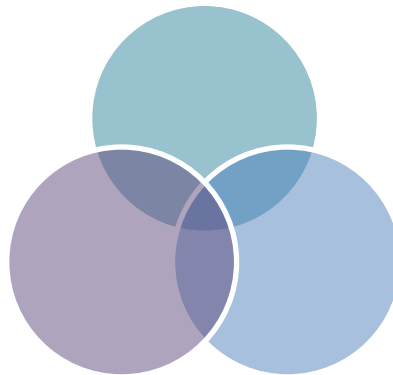
Based on nine strategic goals for Norwegian research

- Five goals pertain to specific areas of research
- Four general goals:
 - High quality research
 - An effective research system
 - Internationalisation of Norwegian research activity
 - Efficiency in use of research resources and results



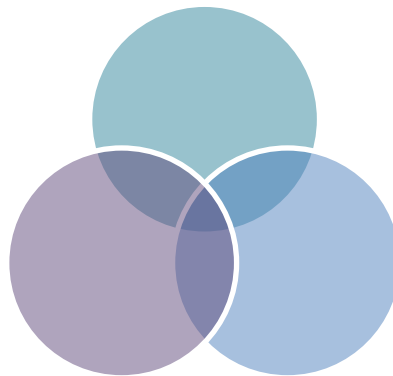
Purpose

- Provide value to society by facilitating cooperation between different research areas.
- Collect and compile information from the research institutions based on a principle of free access for all.
- Provide high quality data on scholarly publication as a basis for the funding system for universities/colleges, research institutes/foundations and specialised health care.



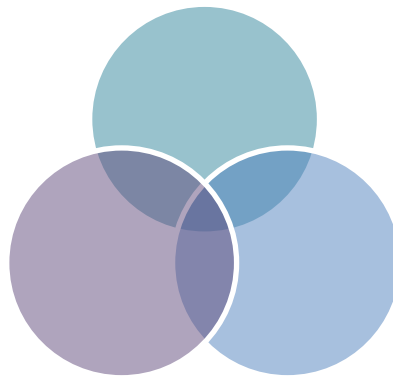
Main tasks in 2011

- Implement use of Norsk Vitenskapsindeks (NVI – Norwegian Scientific Index) in the whole University/college sector, research institute sector and specialised health care
- Simplify administrative routines for researchers.
Facilitate re-use of registered data.
- Establish close contact with users and with relevant organisations and committees



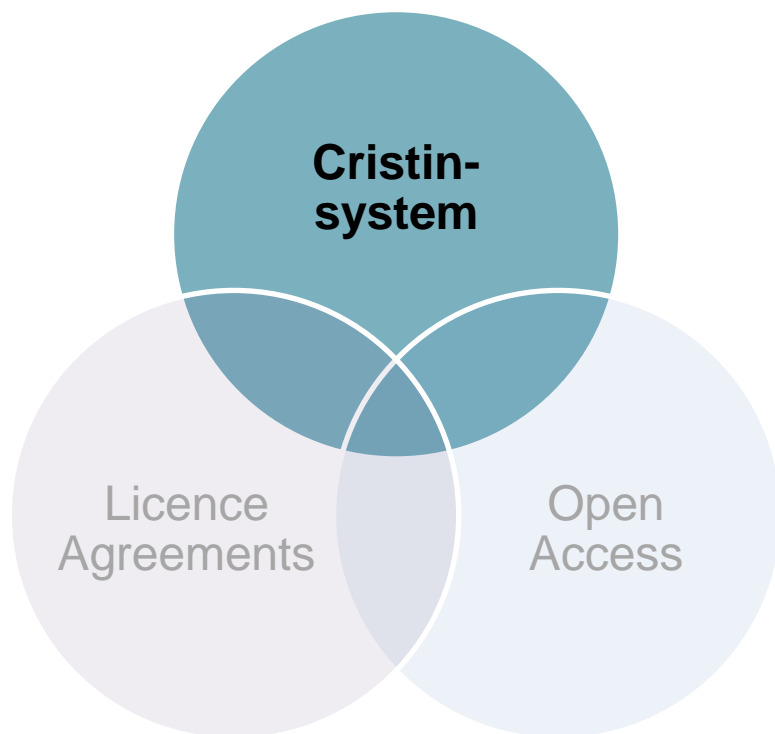
Main tasks in 2011-2012

- Develop the CRIS system according to specifications
- Help increase the amount of openly accessible research publications
- Negotiate best possible license agreements



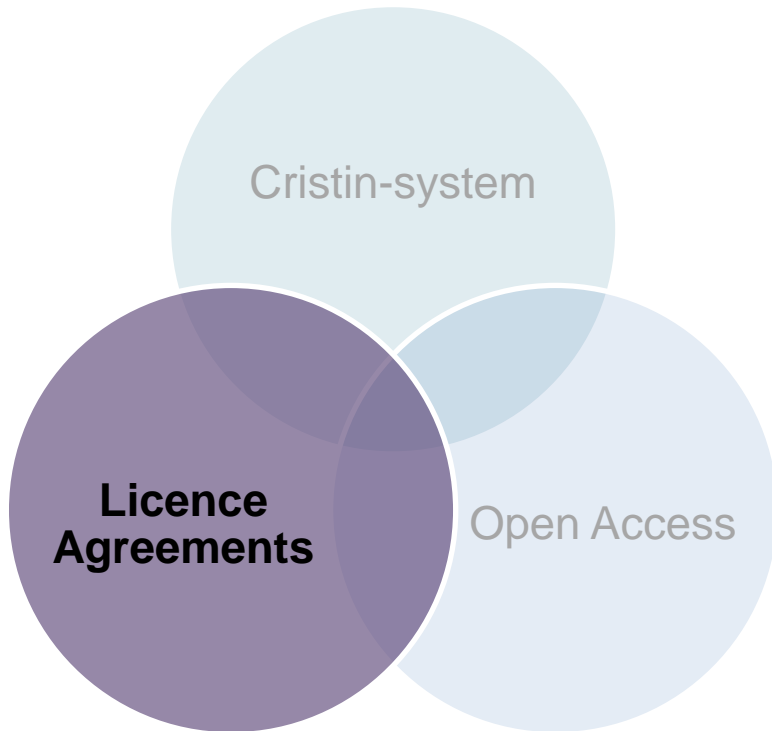
The CRIS in Cristin *(In brief)*

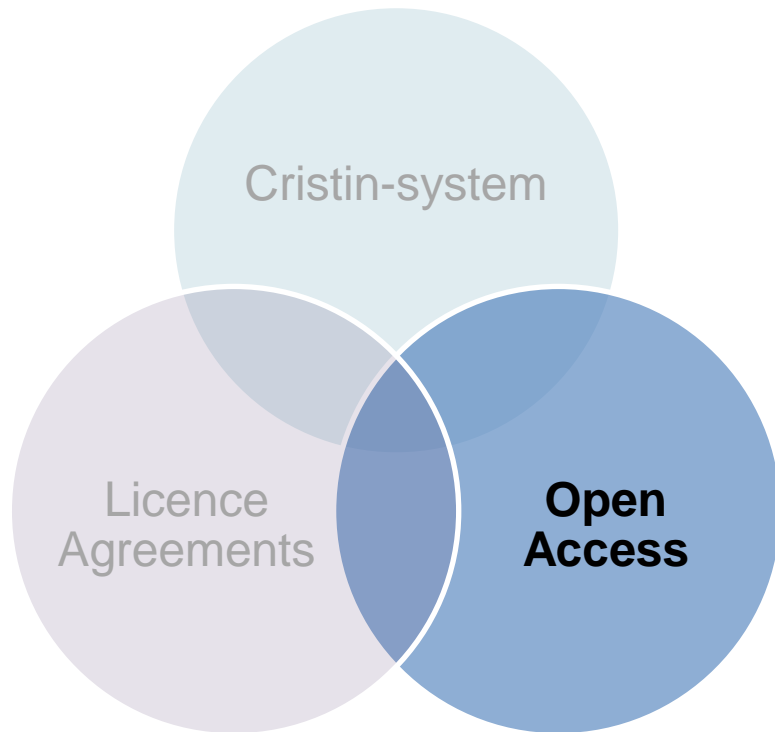
- Make information on Norwegian research openly available
- Primarily cover the needs of researchers and research institutions
- May be used by research institutions for internal purposes (management, documentation, reporting, ...)
- Deliver services to the authorities

Consortia and licence agreements *(In brief)*



- Continue and renegotiate existing agreements
- Investigate alternative models for licencing – National licences?
- Close cooperation with the Norwegian Electronic Health Library (Helsebiblioteket)

Open Access *(In brief)*



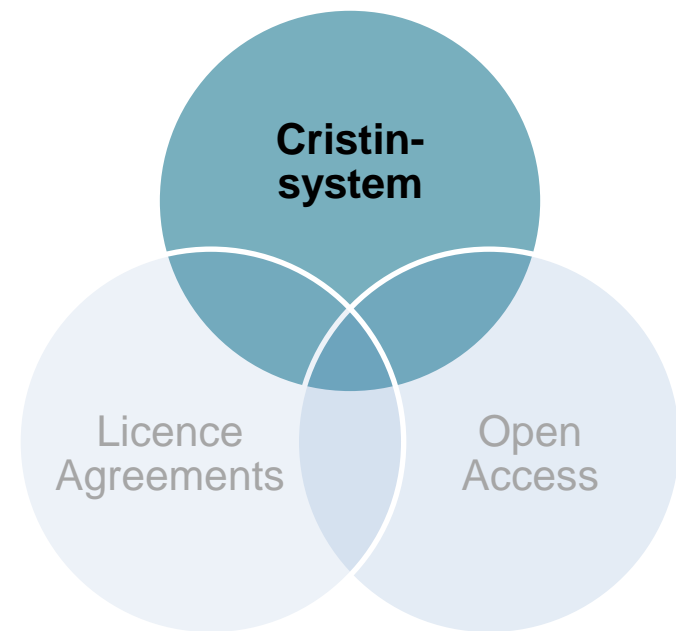
National responsibility for work on Open Access.

- Increase level of knowledge within Norway on Open Access publishing and self archiving in institutional repositories
- Develop tools to measure OA-impact
- Develop tools for institutional repositories
- Boost the golden Open Access-alternative

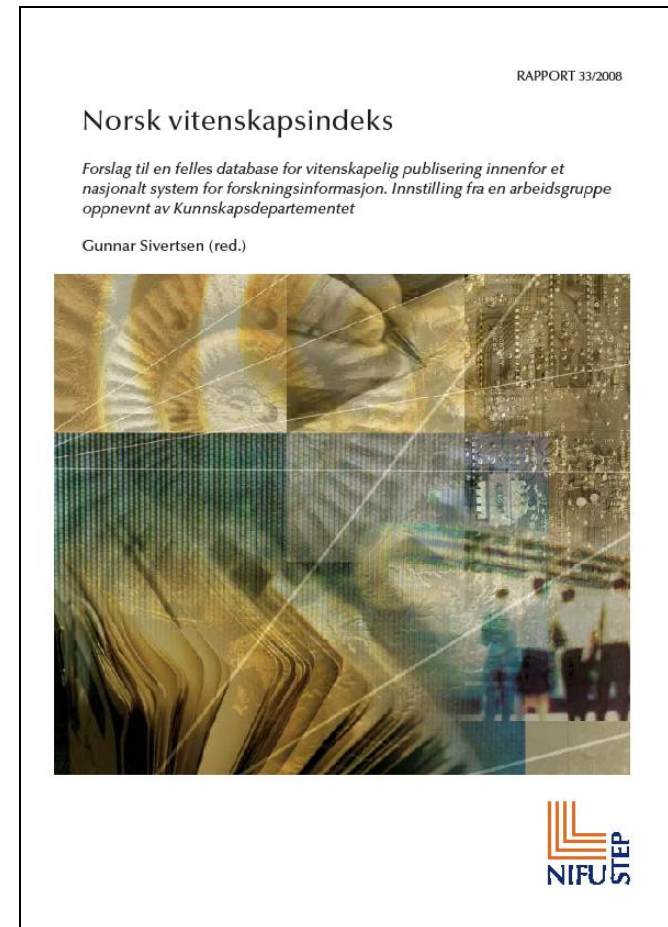

Decision in 2009 to make a national CRIS

- Work group created by the Ministry of education and research
- Worked feb-sep 2008
- Recommended a national database on scholarly publications (Norsk Vitenskapsindeks)
- Cover higher education institutions, hospitals and research institutes
- Recommendation followed by ministry decision in 2009



Decision in 2009



- Build CRIS to be the common research information system for 150+ institutions
- Norsk Vitenskapsindeks is to be part of the system
- A better tool for quality assurance of data on scholarly publications
- Basis for performance based funding
- In production december 1st 2011

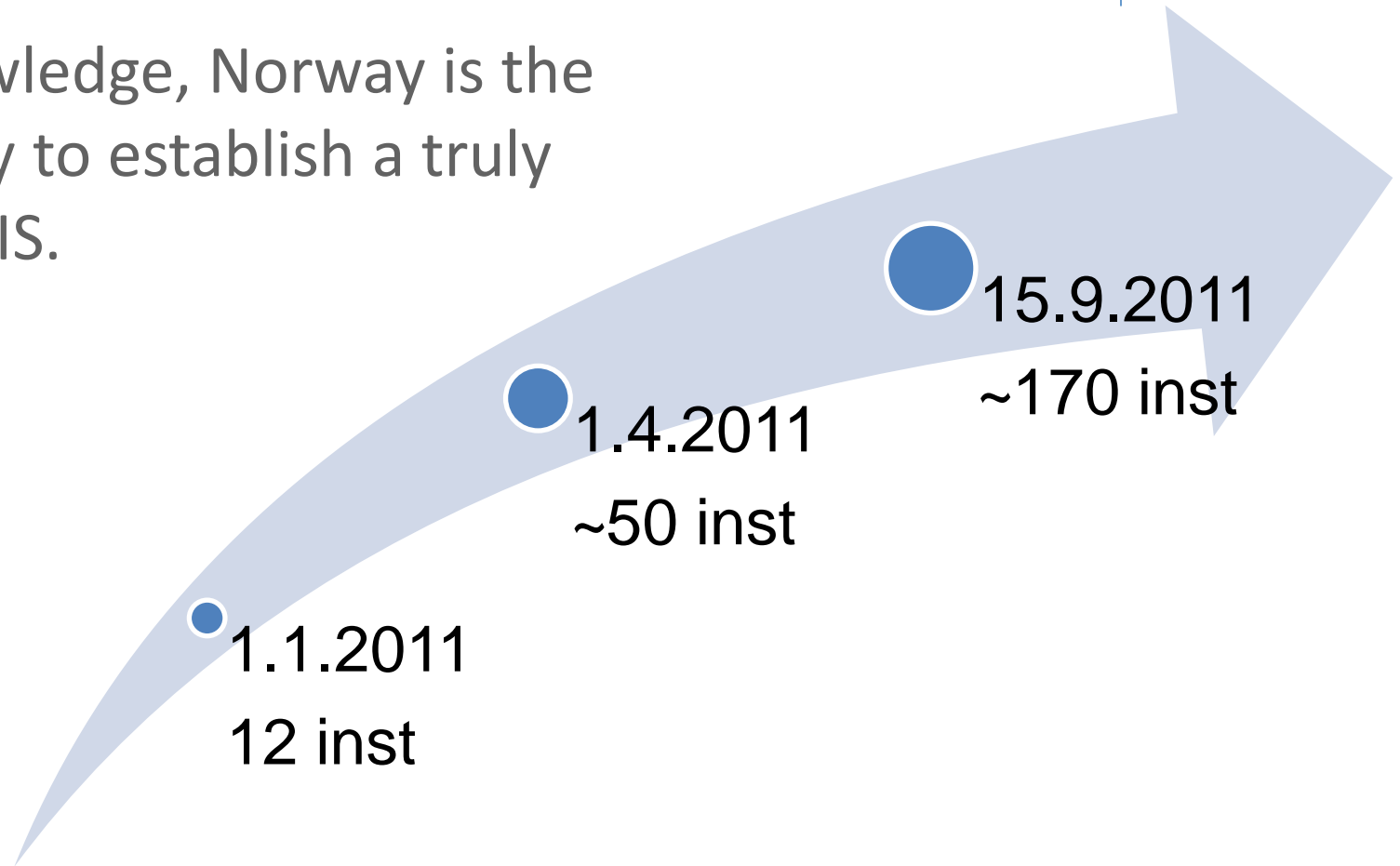
- Research results (publications etc)

- Annual reporting



Testing of the national CRIS 15.9.2011

Cris^{ti}n

To our knowledge, Norway is the first country to establish a truly national CRIS.



Benefits to researchers and institutions



Each publication is registered only once (as opposed to once per participating institution)

Centralised import of bibliographical data
