Advice for Partners

- 1. Facts about the Calls look up the official Progamme web-site and study available documents
- 2. Be prepared know as much as possible about the Programme, what you have to offer, and the opportunities
- 3. Get to know your future partner the Applicant well before you sign a Partnership Agreement. You can apply for travel support
- 4. Make sure you have the necessary resources (financial, technical, people, time) required to contribute to a successful project completion
- 5. Have a responsible approach towards principles of good business practice
- 6. Make sure the project will contribute to the expected liceland which mes and outputs of the Programme
