







Network A: co-author links

#authors: 10186; #records: 40910




Network B: adding co-editor links

authors & editors: 10210; # records: 41635




Network C: adding author-editor link # authors & editors: 10210; # records: 41635





Definition edited books




"a collection of chapters written by different authors collected and harmonized by one or more editors"


- How do you value the edited book compared to articles and monographs?
