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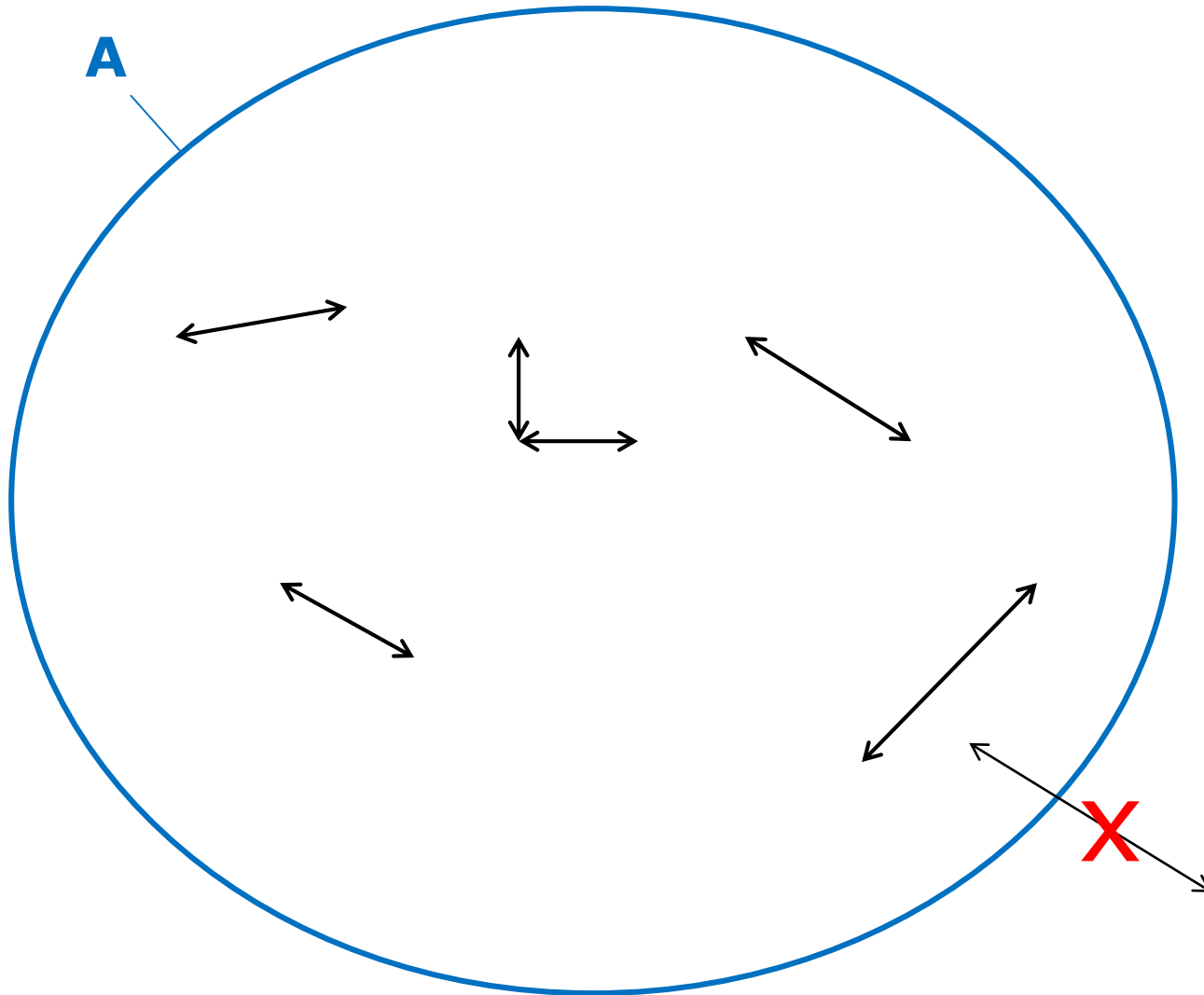

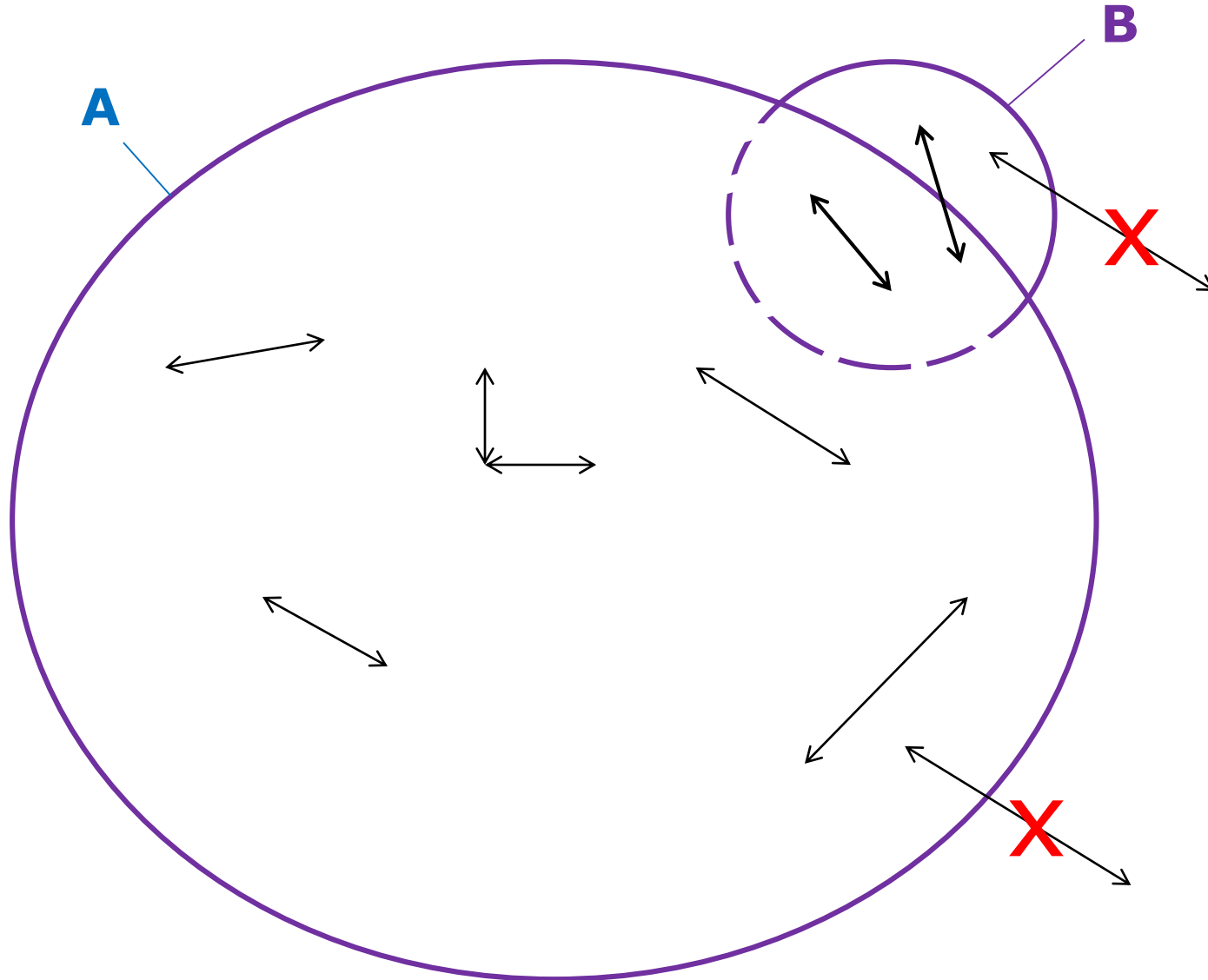
# Network A: co-author links

#authors: 10186 ; #records: 40910



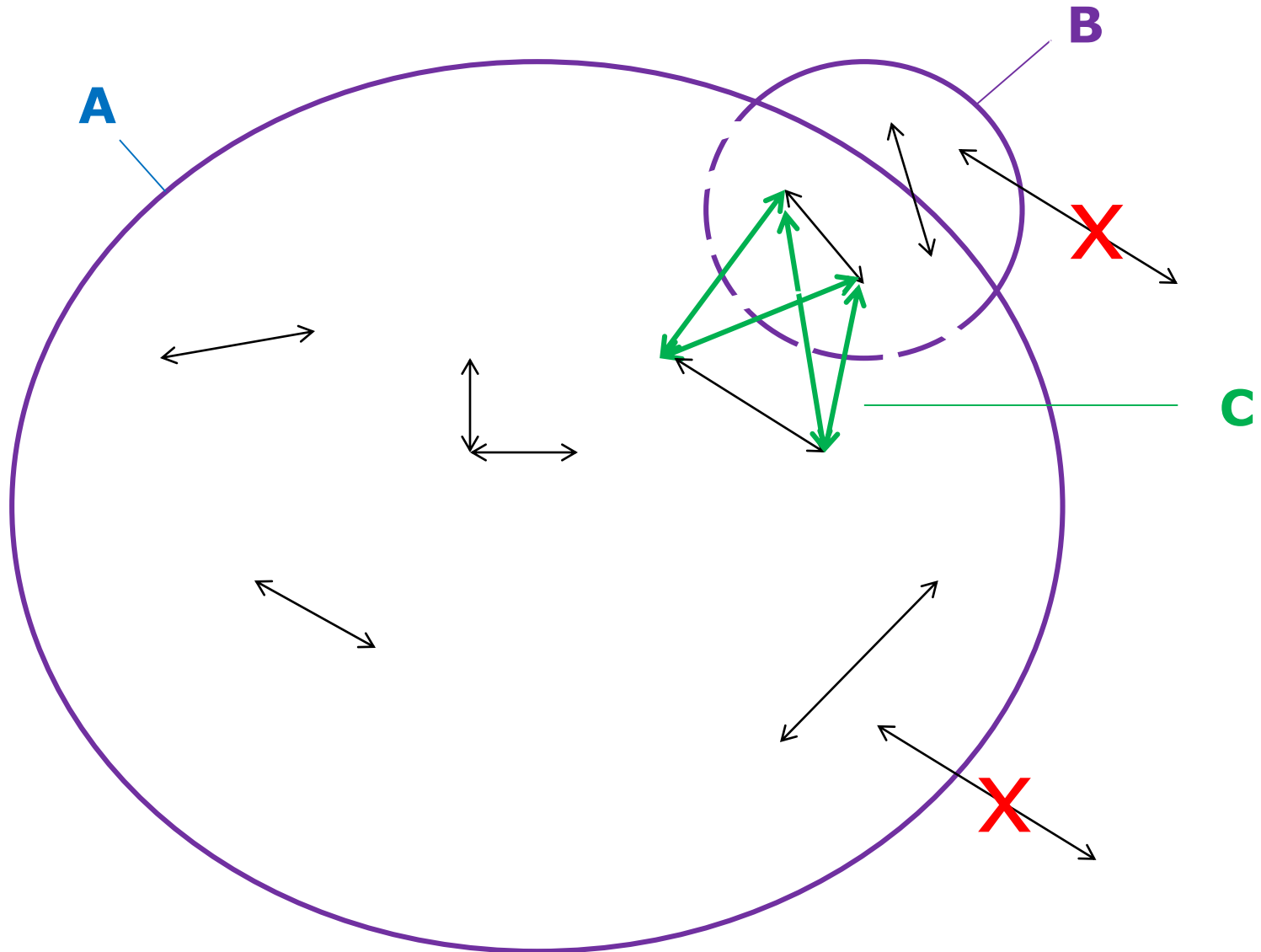
# Network B: adding co-editor links

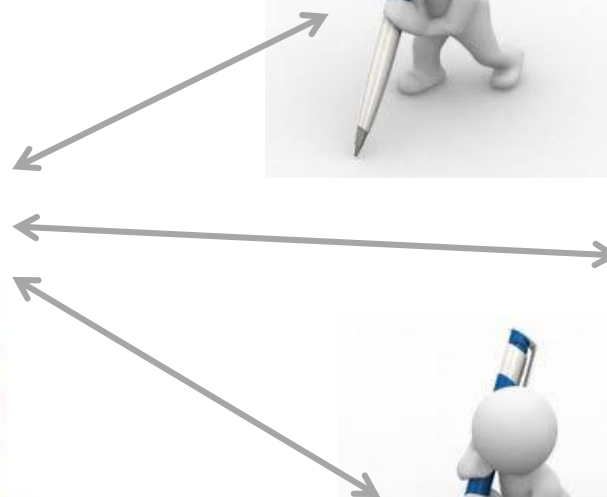

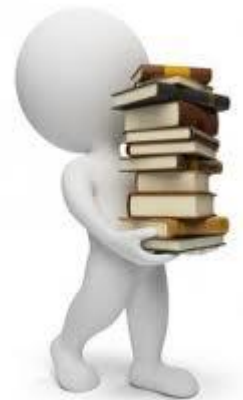

# Network analyses

## Conclusions:

- **Yes**, it makes a difference for individuals
- **No**, it doesn't make a large difference for the whole network

- ...







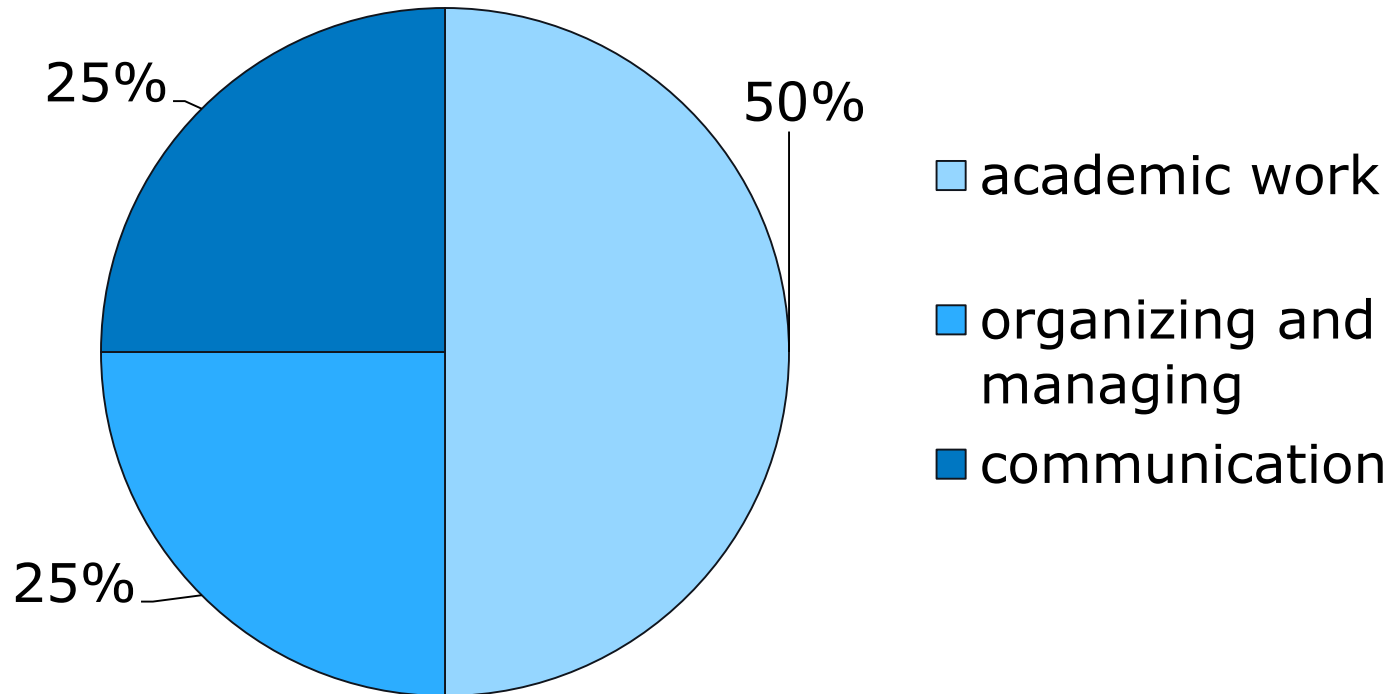
## Questions:
